These important strategic documents are required under the new Local Government Act (2020) and Public Health and Wellbeing Act (2008), which govern the work of Councils in Victoria. All Victorian Councils are working in partnership with their communities to develop these documents.

There will be further opportunities to be involved in conversations about this project in June 2021 and we encourage you and your group to participate.

Suggested meeting agenda

1. Welcome everyone

2. Acknowledgement of Country

We acknowledge the First Peoples of the Millewa-Mallee, The Latji Latji, Ngintait, Nyeri Nyeri and Werigia, as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of the Country on which we are. We pay our respects to the Elders past and present of First Peoples of Millewa-Mallee and the ancient connection they hold with their Country.

3. Introduction

Mildura Rural City Council is supporting the community to develop a 20-year Community Vision. The Community Vision will outline our long-term goals and how we want our region to grow and develop over the next two decades. It will also guide the development of the Council Plan, Financial Plan, Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan, and Asset Plan.

All feedback collected as part of today's discussion will contribute to the development of these documents. The purpose of the discussion today/this evening is to explore what it is that we love and value about our region and your community, what our vision is 20 years from now and to talk about the challenges we might face.

4. Survey questions

Work through the survey, discussing each question as a group (20-30 minutes – longer for larger groups) and making notes for each response as you go.

5. Complete and submit the survey

Tips on how to prepare for and lead a Group Conversation

Group Conversations can take any form, and can take place in any COVID-Safe setting.

- 1. Select a time and location for the conversation.
- 2. Nominate someone to document and submit the conversation.
- 3. Invite people to take part in the conversation.
- 4. Provide participants with the Imagine 2040 Project Fact Sheet and Background Information Sheets prior to the meeting.
- 5. Provide participants with the survey questions before the meeting.
- 6. You might suggest that everyone bring a notepad to write down their ideas during the meeting.

Tips to encourage respectful Group Conversations

You should first request that everyone present be respectful of each other's ideas. There is no wrong or right answer, everyone's opinion is valid and important to them. And it is important that these are captured and included as part of this project.

Online meetings



- Start the meeting by asking that everyone mute their microphones
- Encourage participants to use the hands up button to ask a question, and to wait until they are called on to speak (2 or more mics open at the same time can cause static and feedback)

- Ensure everyone has an equal amount of time to speak. You might go around the (virtual) room and ask each person to present their idea one at time, moving from person to person until everyone has had an opportunity to contribute.
- Alternatively, you might like to put everyone's name
 in a hat and pull names out one at a time or use some
 other method to randomise the presentation of ideas
 so the more talkative participants do not stop the
 participation of the more thoughtful.
- Record the responses to each question, and read back to the participants before moving on to the next question, to ensure participants feel confident with the responses recorded.
- Repeat this process of going around the room for each of the four survey questions.

COVID-Safe face-to-face meeting

- Adapt the online etiquette to suit the face-to-face meeting.
- Remind people to wait until called upon to speak (so as not to speak over others).
- Go around the room to ensure everyone contributes equally to the conversations.
- If available, record the responses on a white board or butchers paper so everyone can see each other's contributions.
